PRINCIPAL'S ARTICLE

Demountable Buildings

Many of you will have noticed the building work that has commenced near the Home Ec buildings. The students certainly enjoyed watching the demolition of the old bike shed and bus shelter. In their place we will have four new classrooms for general teaching purposes in the form of two demountable buildings, which have been funding by the Department due to our growing enrolments. These are due to be delivered during the school holidays for a November completion.

R & R Space

Late in Term 1, Matt Kurzman and myself attended the Stronger Connections Conference, which focused on Trauma Informed Practices. As a result of the outstanding sessions at the conference, Matt and I organised site visits with two schools who are leading the way in Trauma Informed Practices. Based on the information gained, we had a number of ideas that we would like to implement here at Grant High School, starting with the implementation on a co-regulation room.

This term has seen the implementation of the Reset and Return (R&R) space, a non-punitive space to help students manage their Zones (feelings/energy/states of alertness). This space has been set up in CO3 and is currently staffed by three SSO2's, Kylie Schultz, Helyn Young and Judith Praolini. Only one of them are in the room at any given time, but their role is to support students with regulating their emotions so they can successfully return to the classroom ready to learn.

Any student is eligible to access the R & R Space and may do so during lesson time only. Staff are encouraged to gently recommend the use of the R & R Space for students who appear unregulated or are not in the learning zone. Students may also self-refer to the R & R Space if they are feeling the need to access support. The R&R room is being utilised successfully. Feedback from staff and students has been

positive and we are seeing some of our most at-risk students developing beneficial strategies to regulate so they can be more engaged with their learning.

Knockout Sport

This term we have participated in numerous local rounds of Knockout Sports. Our Year 9/10 Girls Netball team were fortunate enough to win the local round and advance to the finals in Adelaide. With the support of Amelia Redman and parent volunteer, Melissa Russell, the team played a stellar competition, earing the title of State Runner-Up's, a fantastic achievement they should be very proud of. Congratulations to Penny Coleman, Gracie Dalton, Georgia Gentile, Eadie Mustart, Chloe Peacock, Shayden Russell, Imogen McGregor and Macy Pearson on their outstanding efforts.

Early next term our Year 9/10 Boys and Girls Basketball Teams will be advancing to Adelaide for the state Knockout final, again supported by Melissa Russell. I would like to personally thank Melissa for her time and expertise.

As I previously mentioned Term 3 has been another very busy term. I would like to acknowledge and thank everyone for their dedication and support for the term and wish all staff, students and families a safe and relaxing holiday.

SCIENCE AND ENGENEERING CHALLENGE

On Wednesday 16th August the annual Science and Engineering Challenge was hosted by Newcastle University at Wulanda Recreation Centre. Seven schools, including Grant High School, were invited to participate in a variety of activities encouraging out-of-the-box thinking around the topic of STEM. Students constructed bridges from popsicle sticks to withstand over ten times their weight, designed towers that could remain intact in an earthquake simulator while carrying weight, and built suspension systems for miniature Mars Rover prototypes. The competition saw frustration, exhilaration, and fierce competitiveness, and after a nail-biting reveal of placings, Grant High School was announced the Regional Champion School, topping the six other schools from the region. Grant finished second in the state overall, missing out on the chance to compete in the national competition by a mere 71 points. Despite the close defeat, the team celebrated with icecreams purchased by Mr McGregor afterward.


